Last year in particular, we focused much of our outreach on improving access and are striving to allow every patient to get the treatment they need with as little wait and inconvenience as possible. Through our 2022 Community Benefit Report, we hope to demonstrate the many ways that Parkside stays involved and impactful in our area by addressing issues of basic needs for the members of our community. 12th Annual "By Your Side" 5k and 1-Mile Fun Run

On the morning of October 8, over 185 participants lined up and prepared to take part in Parkside's 12th Annual "By Your Side" 5k and 1-mile Fun Run. The weather couldn't have been nicer as so many members of the community came together to raise funds for Parkside's very own food pantry. When it was all said and done, over \$30,000 dollars were raised the allows us to assist our patients, both inpatient and outpatient, during times of need through our Patient Assistance Program.





Patient Assistance Programs

Parkside's "By Your Side" Program is funded by Parkside, its employees, the board of directors, and the community through donations and our annual "By Your Side" 5k and fun run.

The "By your side" patient assistance program is our way of doing our part to support our patients, even while they are not within our walls.

Here are our numbers for 2022

- 1194 Parkside clients served through the food pantry patient assistance program
- 3950 family members of clients served
- 80 complete Easter dinner meal sets for families with hams and side dishes.
- 102 complete turkey dinner baskets provided a full meal to needy client families during the holidays
- 157 new books distributed
- 32 cases of Ensure Dietary Supplement, along with adult and child vitamins
- 98 packages of Adult Depends and other personal hygiene supplies
- Countless school supplies, backpacks, baby care items, diapers, coats, hats and gloves for those in need
- Clothing: clothing vouchers at up to \$10 each for a total of \$8,480
- Transportation assistance to ensure appointments, vital transportation needs at discharge and continued care totaling \$7,126.37.

Zero Suicide Initiative

Parkside's zero suicide initiative began with one goal in mind: Make suicide a "never event" for anyone under our care. As a result, our facility has adopted best practices from the suicide prevention resource center and the national action alliance for suicide prevention. Our initiative includes suicide prevention techniques when discharging patients, implementing routine screenings of patients, and extended community outreach our 2022 Zero Suicide Committee's work and activites are as follows.

1/11/22 - Training set for April for Dr. Jobs. Working on other educational opportunities and planning for 2022.

3/8/22 - Finalized the lockbox protocol and made lock boxes available to therapists for their patients who need them upon discharge. These are for patients to take home to secure their medications to help prevent suicide by overdose. These lockboxes were made possible by a grant from the Gaylord Foundation.

4/11/22 - Parkside hosted CEU event Building a Better Suicide Risk Assessment presented by Adam Lesser, LCSW. As a committee, we also started work planning our annual education event for National Suicide Prevention Day.

5/11/22 - Parkside hosted CEU event Innovations in Clinical Suicidology presented by David Jobs, Ph.D., ABPP.

6/9/22 - Dr. E. David Klonsky presented a CEU event "Understanding Suicide to Prevent Suicide". Ken Moore passed the Chair of this committee to Gail Flack when he left.

7/14/22 - Gail Flack took over as Chair of the Committee due to Ken Moore leaving Parkside. Discussions and planning about National Suicide Prevention Day events.

8/9/22 - Reviewed plans for September events and reviewed data on CSSR-S and safety planning as previously implemented by this committee. Made plans to refresh therapist training in these areas.

9/16/22 - The committee hosted education/activity event for Suicide Awareness Day. It was well attended by staff. We also held a candlelight vigil for staff & community members affected by suicide. News coverage came for this and interviewed Gail Flack.

11/9/22 - Working on our annual internal evaluation of zero suicide with policies and trainings and processes

Training the Next Generation



Parkside prides itself in its ability to provide care to everyone, regardless of ability to pay. We accept Medicare, Medicaid and most private insurances. While claims are prepared to collect for the services we provide, vital and emergency inpatient treatment services are provided, even if payment is not assured. Uninsured or underinsured patients are assisted in determining eligibility for subsidized health coverage or for Parkside's financial assistance or charity care program. This includes free or discounted health services, provided to those that meet the aforementioned guidelines.


Bad debt is a quantifiable, uncollectable amount that is the responsibility of, but not paid by patients. Bad debt is the cost we incur as a result of services provided to patients for which payment was expected but never received. This can happen for many reasons, such as an uninsured patient's income being above the guideline for financial assistance but still cannot afford the cost of services, or when insured patients cannot afford co-pays or deductibles. Parkside is, of course, willing and able to work with patients and their families when they may fall on hard times and are unable to pay. Our Business Office will attempt to connect patients with financial assistance programs and establish payment plans, for instance. A portion of bad debt, along with what was previously mentioned, could also be attributed to patients who qualified for financial assistance but failed to apply.

Here are the totals for these types of care:

UNCOMPENSATED CARE FOR 2022:

- Charity \$156,869 = 1.25 % of Net PatientRevenues
- Bad Debt \$457,122 = 3.64 % of Net Patient Revenues
- Total \$613,991 = 4.89 % of Net PatientRevenues

Non-essential services and services that are not appropriate to a hospital setting may be excluded from this policy. Information can be obtained by calling our Business Office staff at 918-588-8850. Business office representatives can help determine if someone meets the specific income guidelines to qualify for financial assistance.
